

Liberty National Bank—Renovation Lawton, Oklahoma

The original three-story office building at 7th and B Street in downtown Lawton was built in the early 1970's for the Public Service Company of Oklahoma.

In 2011, Liberty National Bank contacted BYSP to begin a design process to convert the pre-cast, nearly windowless austere building into a classical architectural style that would represent the permanence, stability and conservatism of Liberty National Bank.

The entire exterior skin of the building is being removed and new cast stone, brick and classical windows are being installed to achieve the look of a main-street financial institution, reminiscent of the days before urban renewal in downtown Lawton.

The completed project includes three floors (12,000 sf per floor) with an abundance of windows, natural light, tall ceilings and Class A office space on the upper floors.
